

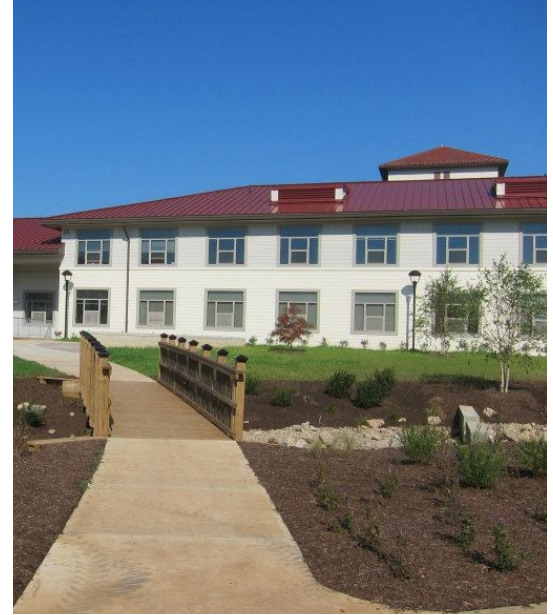

SMITHSONIAN MASON CONSERVATION DORMITORY AND DINING HALL

The project consists of a student/professional dormitory with approximately 125 beds and offices, common spaces, and support spaces. The dining hall has seating for 75 people and is supported by a full kitchen and serving area. The buildings are built using composite metal deck systems.

The project site was an undeveloped portion of the existing Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute in Front Royal, VA. The project was delivered using the Design/

Build contracting method, led by W.M. Jordan. Designs were submitted and reviewed through the BCOM process.

The project was completed in late 2012 and was ready for the Fall Semester for George Mason University students. Both buildings are currently seeking LEED Gold Certification.
